Normandale Community College was founded in 1968 and is the largest college and second largest undergraduate institution in the Minnesota State Colleges and Universities system. In FY23, Normandale served almost 14,000 students in our for-credit courses and awarded more than 1,500 degrees and certificates in more than 60 programs of study.

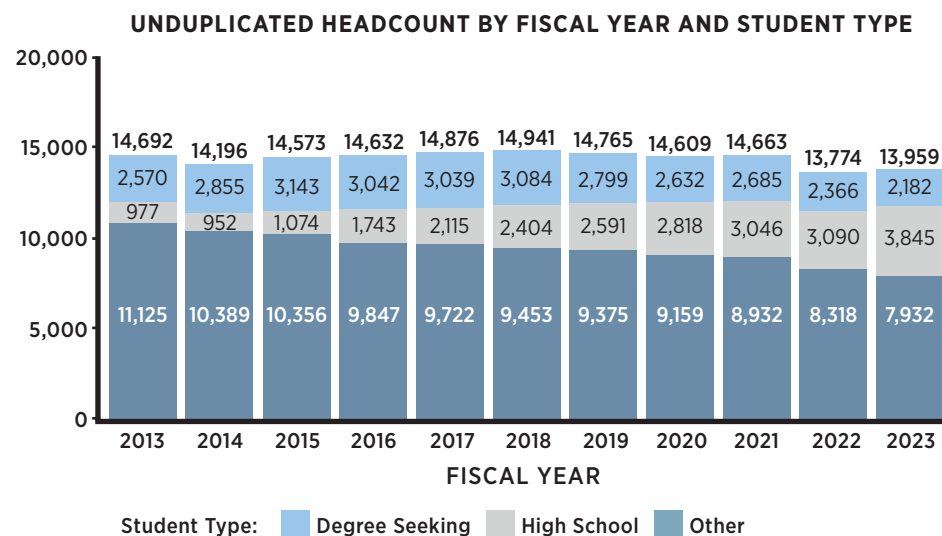
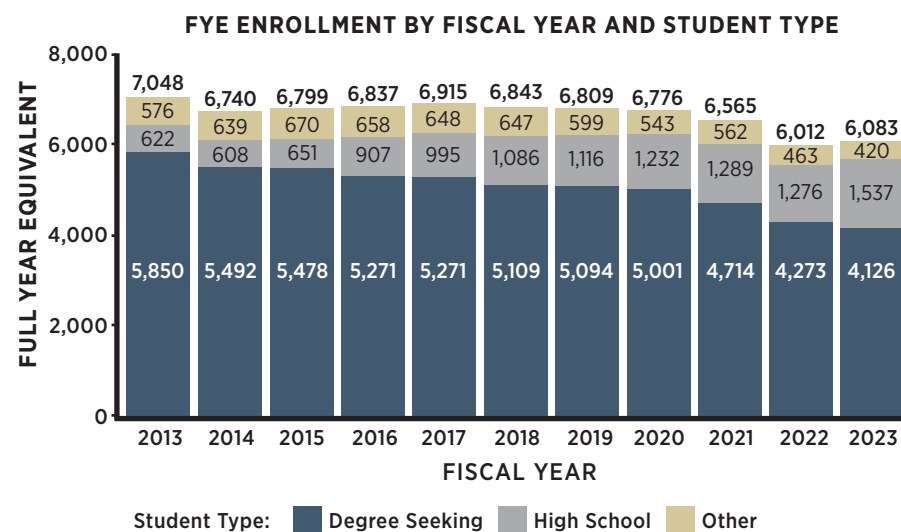

Fiscal Year Enrollment Trends

DEFINITIONS:

Full Year Equivalent (FYE) - total credit hours over a fiscal year divided by 30.

Unduplicated Headcount - count of unique students by fiscal year.



Note: A student can be re-admitted as a different Student Type (also known as admit status) within a fiscal year, resulting in the fiscal year total for unduplicated headcount being possibly less than the sum of values shown by category.

Courses & Enrollment by Delivery Method

DEFINITIONS:

Hybrid - blends online and face-to-face delivery, resulting in reduced classroom time but more than two face-to-face meetings per term.

In Person - course delivery takes place face-to-face.

Online - course delivery is entirely or predominantly online; one to two activities may occur face-to-face.

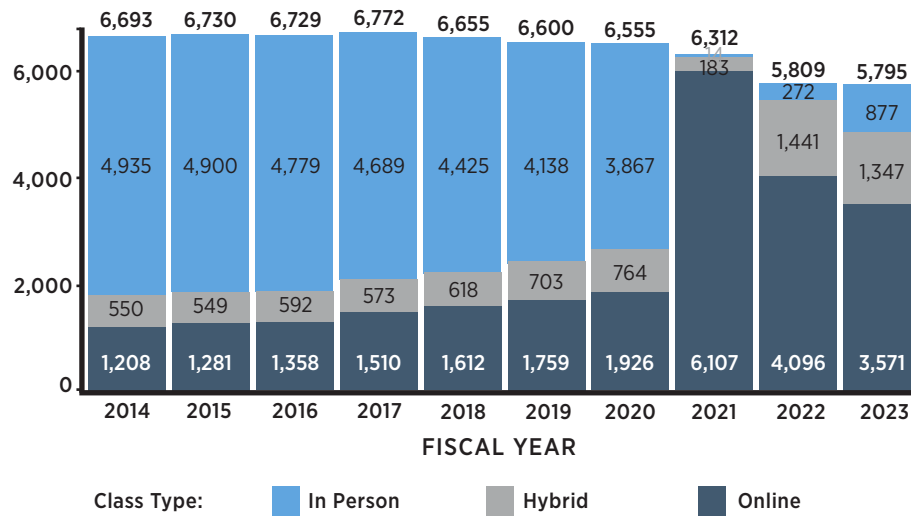
All In Person - student was enrolled only in in-person classes (excludes hybrid classes).

All Online - student was enrolled only in online classes (excludes hybrid classes).

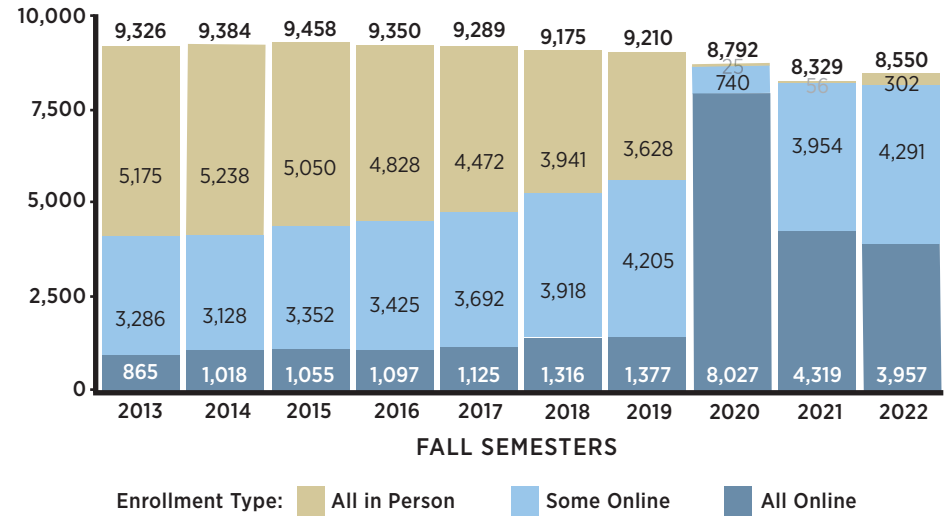

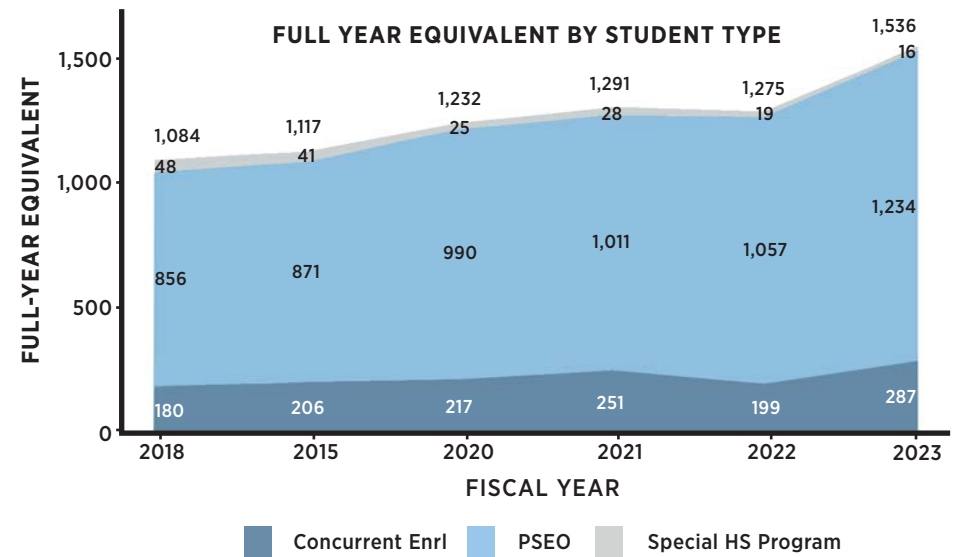
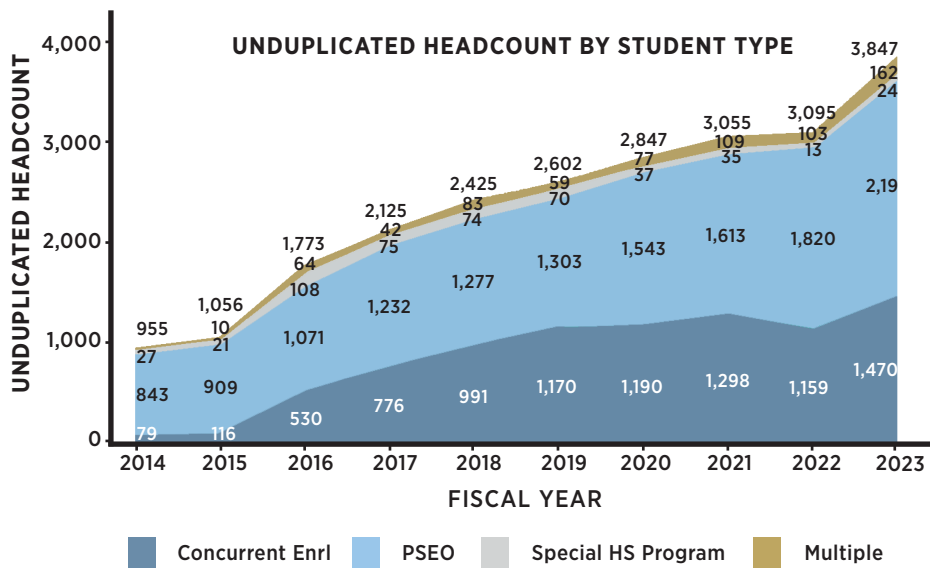
Unduplicated headcount: a count of unique individuals per time period.

Concurrent Enrollment: High school students taking courses in the high school from high school instructors who are supported by a Normandale faculty member.

Post-secondary Education Option (PSEO): High school students taking regular courses at Normandale.

Special High School Programs: High school students enrolled in programs like Dimensions Academy or the Bloomington Career and College Academy.



Notes: The “Multiple” category indicates that the student was enrolled as two or more different high school Student Types within the fiscal year. FYE by high school student type is based off of enrollment at the course-level, which can fluctuate slightly from credit totals that are reported elsewhere.

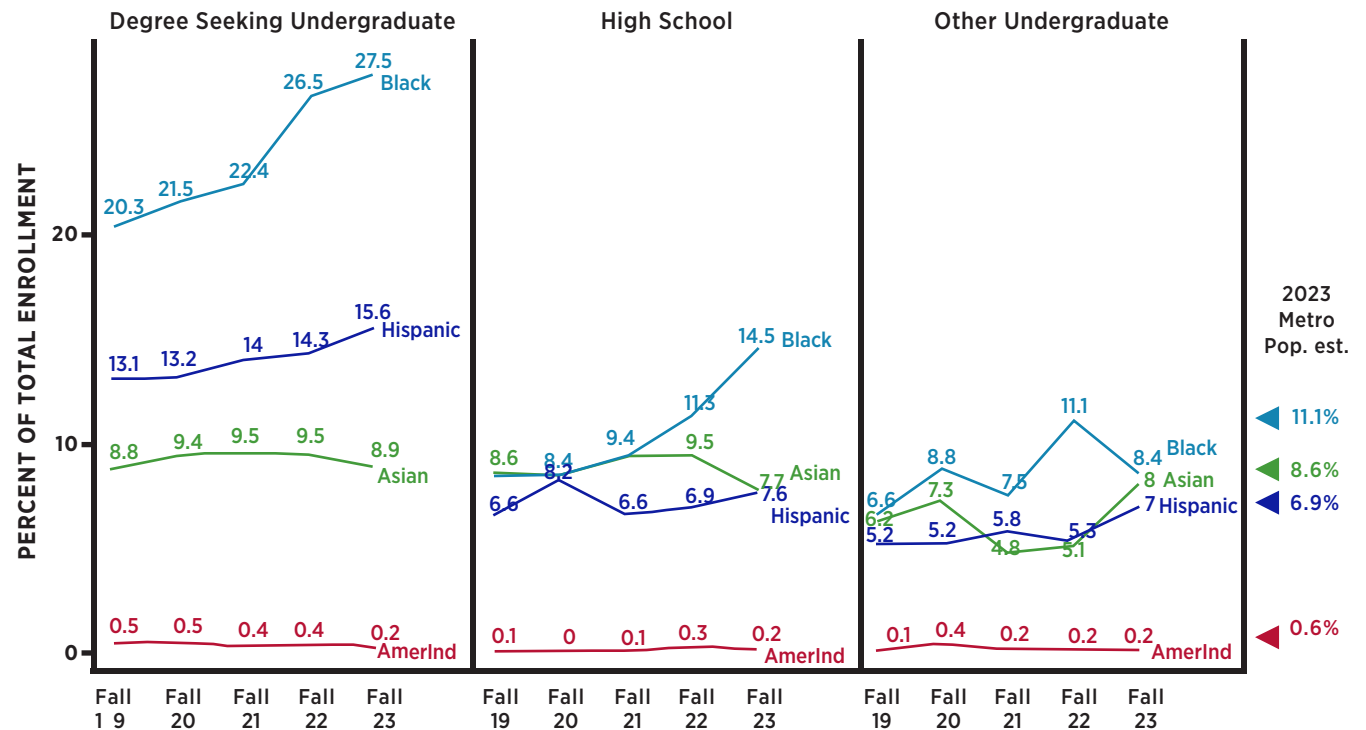

Note: Triangles at right mark the percent of total population for demographic groups, based on Minnesota State Demographer projections for 2023 for the Twin Cities metro area.

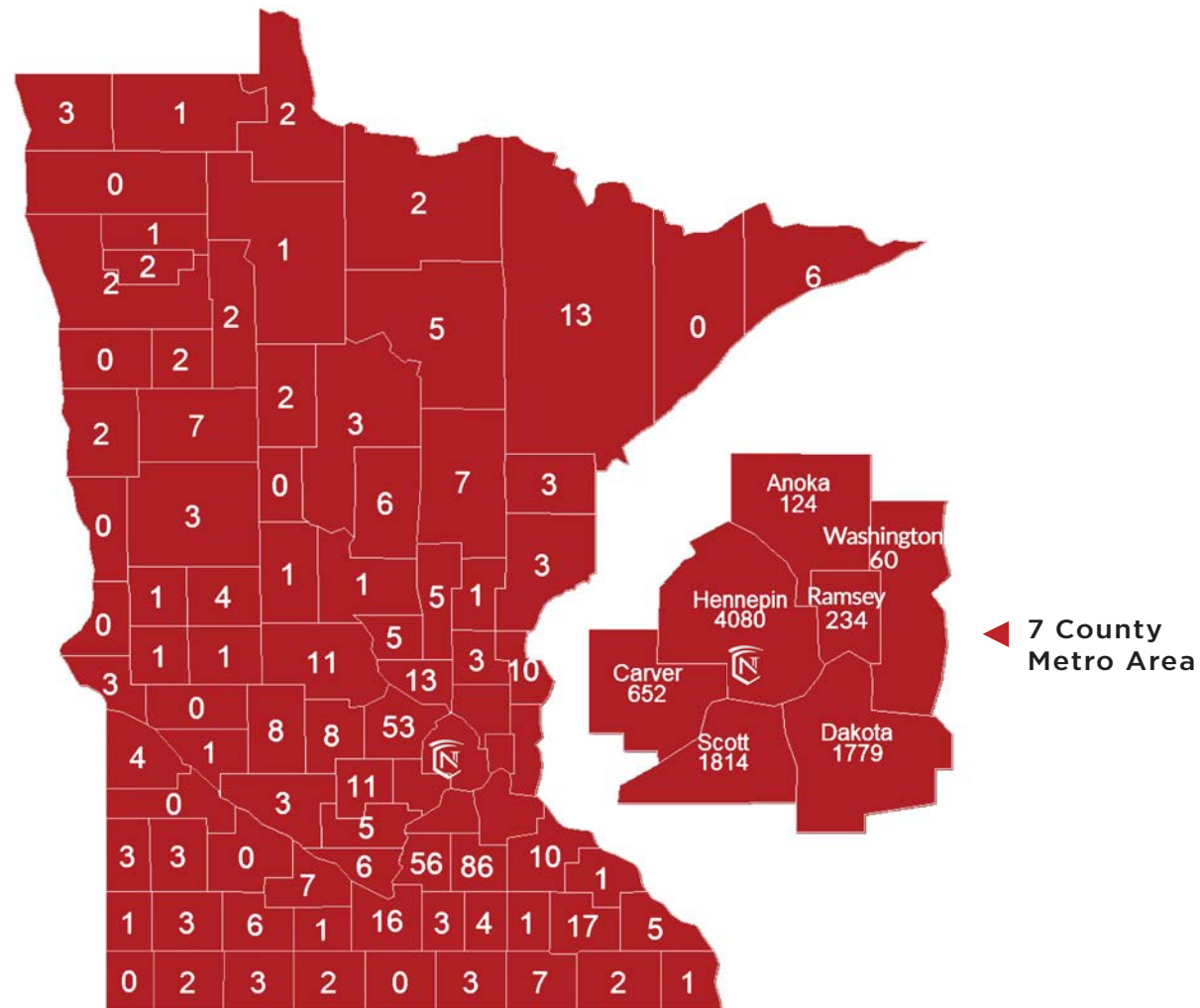

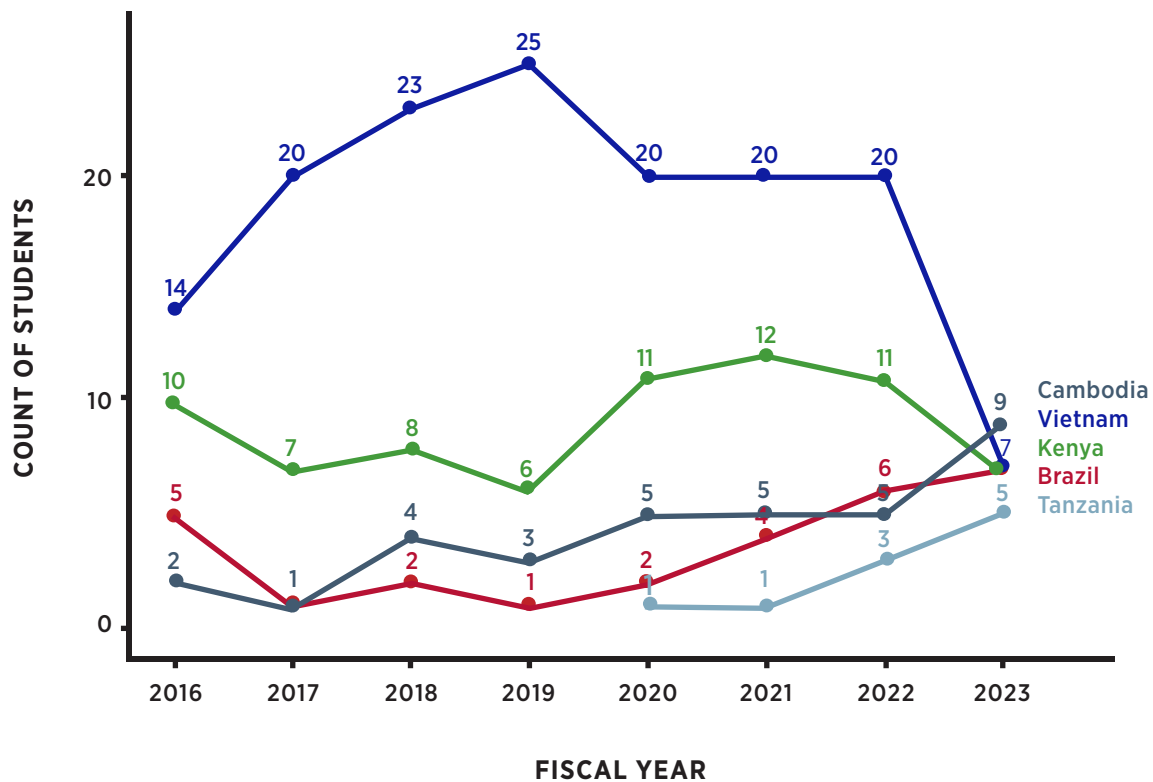

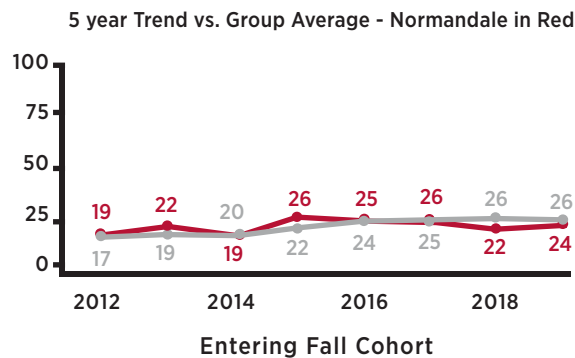

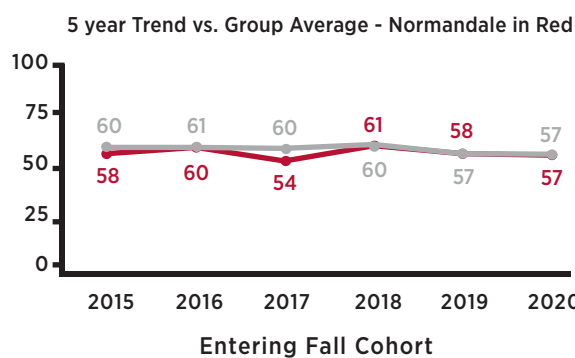
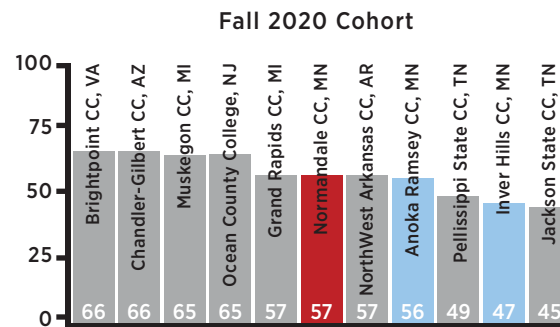

Data come from the Integrated Post-Secondary Education Data System (IPEDS). Two Minnesota State colleges are included in the group and are highlighted in blue.

- **Graduation rate:** the number of completers (unduplicated) of associate and certificate programs within 150% time-to-degree (e.g. 3 years for an associate degree) out of fall cohorts of first-time, full-time degree seeking undergraduates.
- **Retention rate:** the number of degree seeking undergraduates from the prior fall cohort (full- or part-time, as indicated) who are still enrolled in the institution or have completed their program of study.

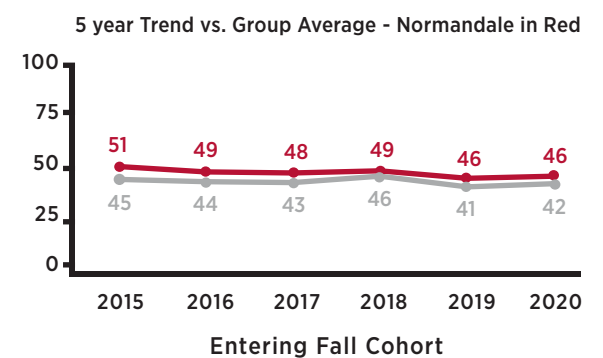
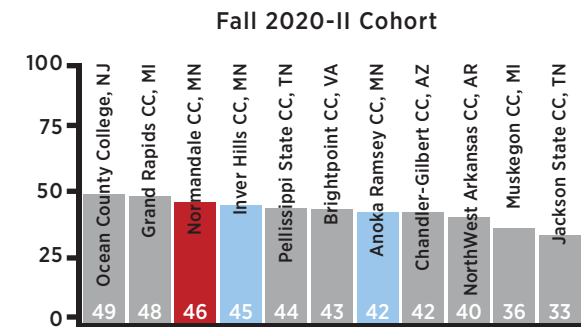
150% TIME (3 YEAR) GRADUATION RATE FOR FIRST-TIME, FULL-TIME STUDENTS

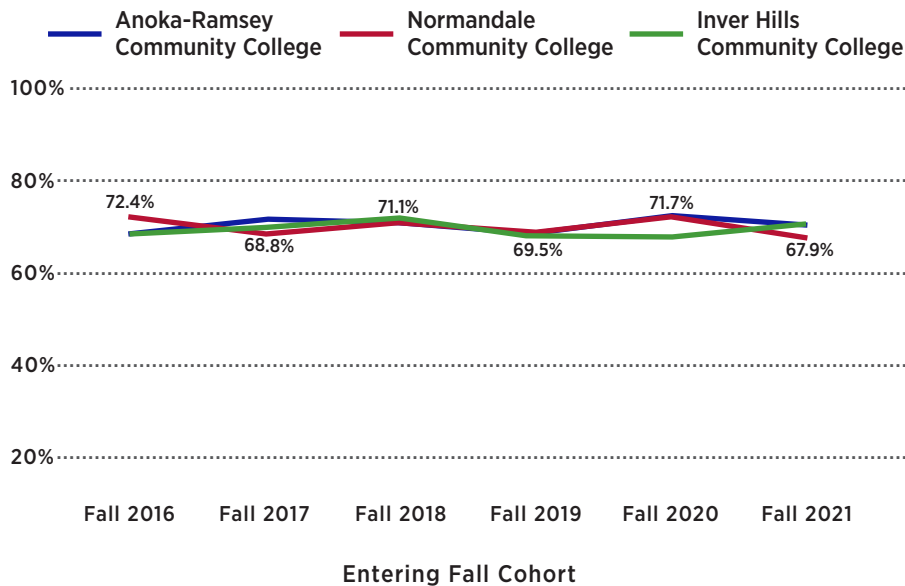

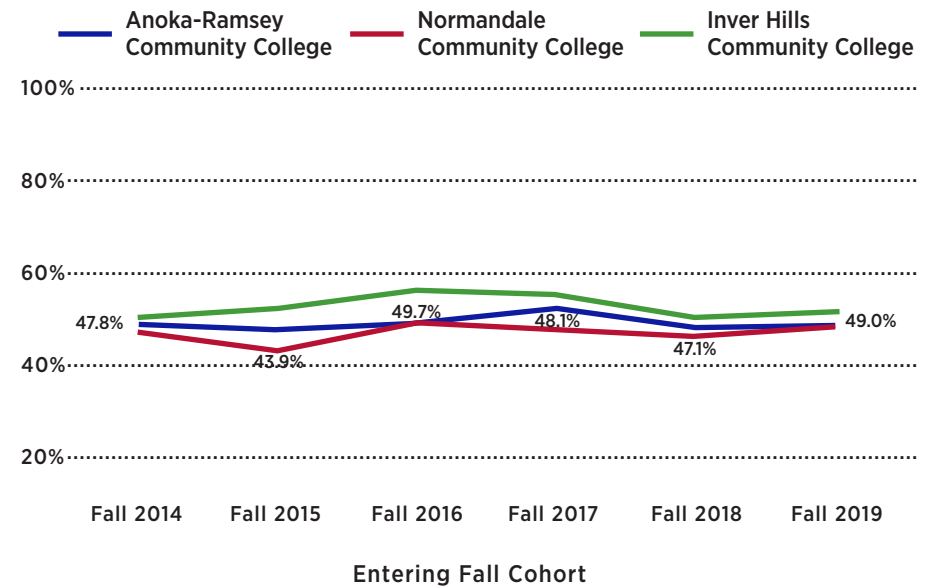

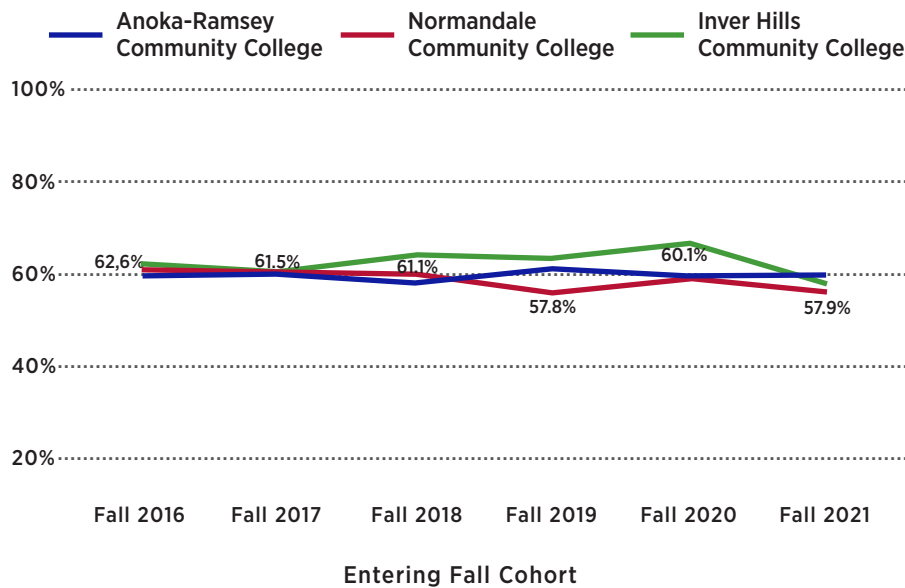

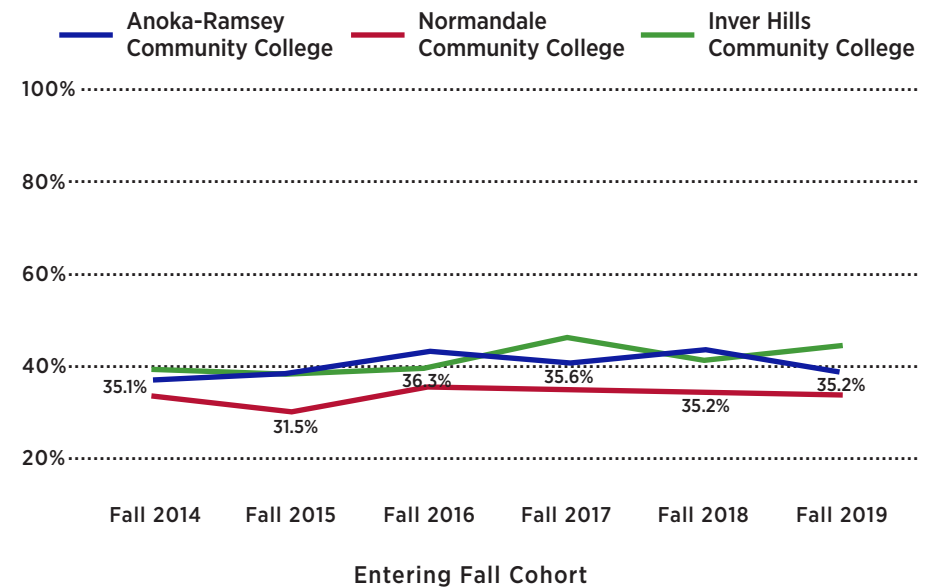

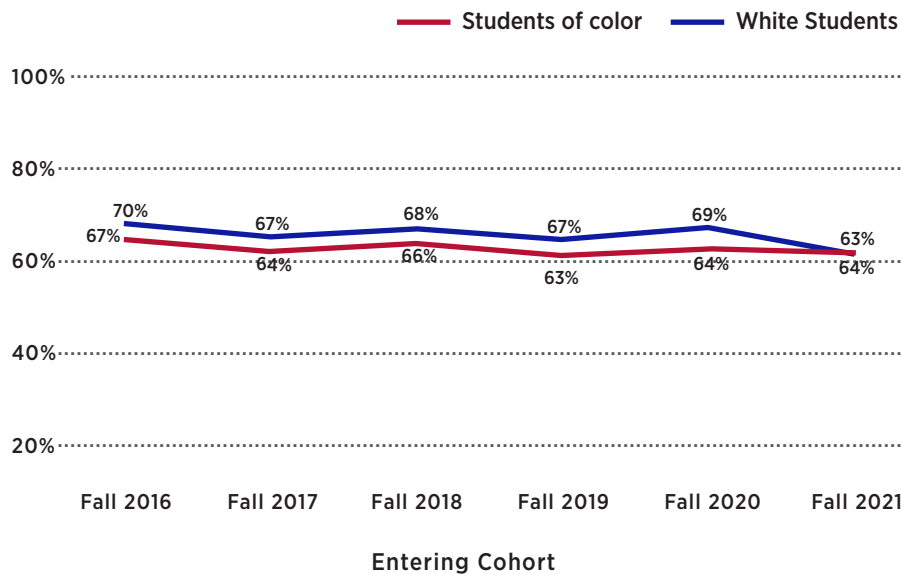

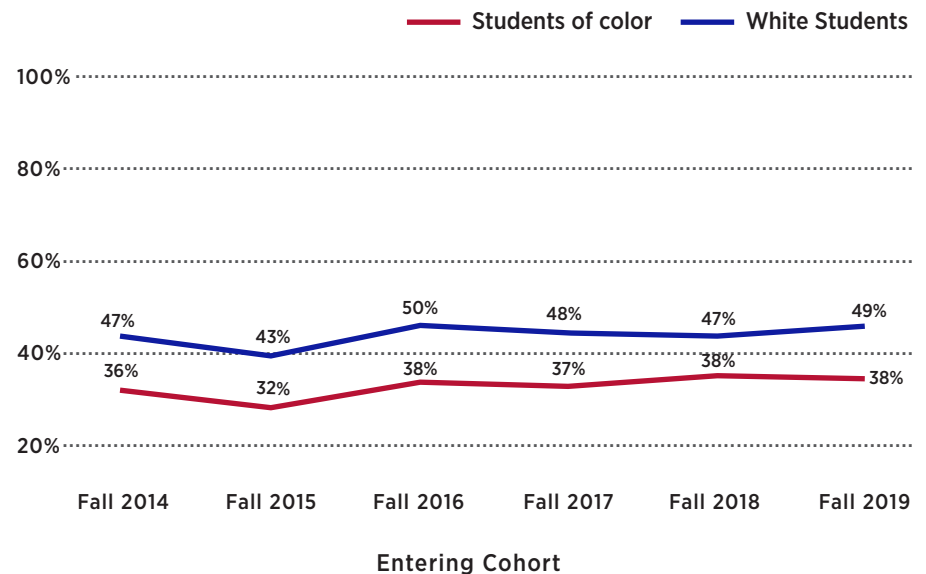

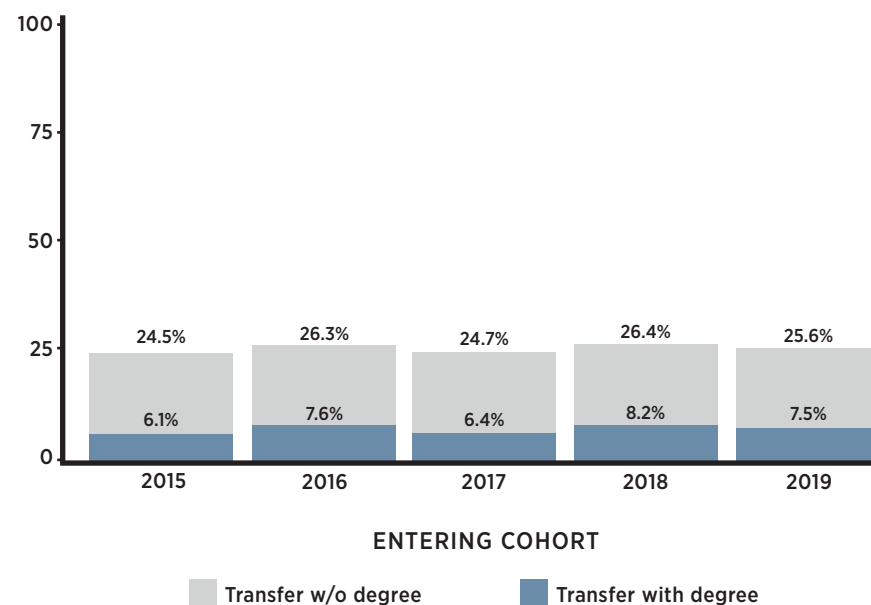

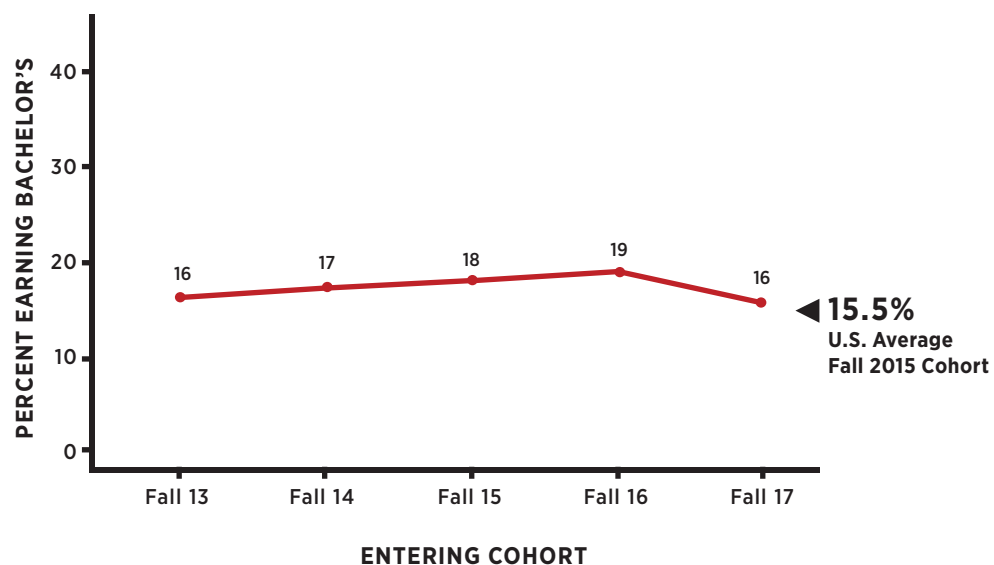
