- 9. Demonstrate aptitude in accurate observation, recording and evaluation of the extra/intra-oral condition of the patient.
- 10. Demonstrate skills in accurate observation, recording and evaluation of the hard and soft tissue.
- 11. Demonstrate competency in utilizing patient radiographs during assessment and treatment procedures.
- 12. Analyze patient data and formulate a dental hygiene diagnosis for each clinical patient.
- 13. Demonstrate knowledge in assessing, planning, implementing, evaluating, and documenting dental hygiene care.
- 14. Demonstrate proficiency in informing and involving each patient in all aspects of decision making, planning, implementation, and evaluation of their care.
- 15. Recognize findings obtained in patient assessment that may require a referral.
- 16. Demonstrate performance in identification and removal of supragingival and subgingival deposits on natural or restored tooth surfaces.
- 17. Demonstrate competency in identification and removal of supragingival stain from natural or restored tooth surfaces.
- 18. Utilize appropriate instruments for clinical procedures according to principles of design, function, and nature of task.
- 19. Demonstrate experience in instrument sharpening skills.
- 20. Demonstrate proficiency in the use of a mechanical polisher.
- 21. Utilize appropriate topical fluoride modality for specific patient needs.
- 22. Demonstrate efficiency in the technique of applying topical fluoride.
- 23. Evaluates individual patient self-care needs and demonstrates proficiency in patient counseling.
- 24. Demonstrate use of oral physiotherapy aids.
- 25. Demonstrate proficiency in the care and cleaning of removable appliances.
- 26. Performs supportive services to aid in the operation of the dental clinic.
- 27. Apply current research as it relates to the clinical practice of dental hygiene care.
- 28. Apply ethical, legal, and regulatory concepts in the provision of oral health care services as they relate to clinical practice.

- 29. Manage the patient's electronic and paper records accurately and responsibly.
- 30. Utilize skills in time management and organization for efficient appointment planning, patient scheduling and record keeping.
- 31. Maintain professional rapport with patients, peers, faculty, and staff.
- 32. Develop competence in providing the dental hygiene process of care which includes: Assessment, Planning, Implementation and Evaluation for all clinical patients.
