- 10. Demonstrate competency in utilizing patient radiographs during assessment and treatment procedures.
- 11. Analyze patient data and formulate a dental hygiene diagnosis for each clinical patient.
- 12. Demonstrate competency in assessing, planning, implementing, evaluating, and documenting dental hygiene care.
- 13. Demonstrate competency in informing and involving each patient in all aspects of decision-making planning, implementation, and evaluation of their care.
- 14. Recognize findings obtained in patient assessment that may require referral.
- 15. Demonstrate competency in identification and removal of supragingival and subgingival deposits on natural or restored tooth surfaces.
- 16. Demonstrate competency in identification and removal of supragingival stain from natural or restored tooth surfaces.
- 17. Utilize appropriate instruments for clinical procedures according to principles of design, function, and nature of the task.
- 18. Demonstrate competency in instrument sharpening skills
- 19. Demonstrate competency in the use of a mechanical polisher.
- 20. Utilize appropriate topical fluoride modality for specific patient needs.
- 21. Demonstrate competency in the technique of applying topical fluoride.
- 22. Evaluates individual patient self-care needs and demonstrates competency in patient counseling.
- 23. Demonstrates competency in teaching the use of oral physiotherapy aids to patients.
- 24. Demonstrates competency in the care and cleaning of removable appliances.
- 25. Demonstrate competency in hand instrumentation and ultrasonic instrumentation.
- 26. Demonstrate knowledge and competence in the use of air polishing systems.
- 27. Demonstrate competency in oral irrigation.

- 28. Demonstrate competency in alginate impressions, study casts, pit and fissure sealant placement, and whitening trays.
- 29. Manage patient records accurately and responsibly using Eaglesoft dental software.
- 30. Utilize skills in time management and organization for efficient appointment planning, patient scheduling and record keeping.
- 31. Maintain professional rapport with patients, peers, faculty, and staff.
- 32. Develop competence in providing the dental hygiene process of care which includes: Assessment, Planning, Implementation, Evaluation, and Documentation for all clinical patients.
- 33. Performs supportive services to aid in the operation of the dental clinic.
- 34. Recognize when an emergency is imminent and act according to NCC protocol.
