- 12. Discuss the dental caries process including demineralization, remineralization and cavitation.
- 13. Discuss the role of fluoride in dental health.
- 14. The student will be able to complete a dietary assessment while looking at the client's nutritional profile.
- 15. Identify the various mouthrinses that are available for dental patient usage.
- 16. Report on the various dentifrices available to the dental client.
- 17. Identify the importance of dentinal hypersensitivity and desensitization techniques for the dental client.
