

Normandale Art Student Scholarship Bryant Family Scholarship for Spring 2022

Through a generous donation by the Normandale Foundation, a limited number of \$1,000 **Bryant Family scholarships** are available. *The Bryant Family scholarship* awarded for the spring semester 2022 is available to AFA in Art students attending Normandale Community College in the Fall term of 2021 and Spring term of 2022. Previous recipients of either the **Bryant Family scholarship** or the **Felicity Abby Jane Mathieu scholarship** are ineligible.

To be eligible for consideration for this scholarship you must:

- Be a current full-time or part-time Normandale Student
- Returning student in Spring 2022
- Accepted to the AFA in Art degree program
(May submit concurrently with scholarship application)
- Have satisfactory academic standing - GPA of 3.0 in Art
- Submit a portfolio of 4 strongest original artworks
(Submitted artworks were created in the last 2 years)
- Submit a current transcript or Degree Audit Report (DARS)

Normandale Art Student Scholarship Portfolio Guidelines

Portfolio Requirement

Submit a digital portfolio of artwork (4 pieces) to the Art Faculty AFA in Art Coordinator along with your application and DARS report. Work will be reviewed by Art Department Faculty. There may be additional requirements upon receiving the award.

Photographing your work:

Work should be placed against a neutral background, cropped as close to the image as possible, and be free of distortion or glare. Exposures should be bracketed allowing you to select the best exposure to include in the portfolio. Remember to take images as high-resolution TIFF files (300 ppi or higher) and keep these images as a master and submit edited files as JPEG.

Recommended Types of Artwork

- The portfolio must consist of only 4 examples of your strongest work created within the last two years.
- Submitted work must be original rather than from copying photographs or creating fan art.
- Submitted work should avoid a style that is not your own such as Anime or Manga.

Sending separate images:

Images should be emailed to the AFA in Art Coordinator as JPEGs (the filename will end with .jpg) with longest side at 1920 ppi and not exceeding 5MB. Image files should be labeled with your name and the number 01 through 04, indicating your preferred viewing order (example: AnnOlson01.jpg). Do not include a caption, title of work or any other information in the filename, as it may disrupt the viewing order. Complete the image list below or create a word document with the required information.

Sending images as a PowerPoint:

Email completed PowerPoint as a PDF to AFA in Art Coordinator. PowerPoint slides should have a solid background. Images should fill as much of the space as possible. Provide your name, the medium or media, dimensions of the actual image or object, and its date of creation (see chart above) on each PowerPoint slide.
