

#### Course Outline for: ANTH 2096 Internship in Anthropology

## A. Course Description

- 1. Number of credits: 2-4
- 2. Internship hours per week: Variable (45 hours per credit/semester)
- 3. Prerequisites: ANTH 1100 and consent of instructor
- 4. Corequisites: None
- 5. MnTC Goals: None

This internship course explores museology careers and training in a supervised work setting and combines theory with field experience in an approved museum environment. Students must complete 45 hours per credit on the job, additional academic work, and meet with a faculty member monthly for the duration of this internship. Students may earn 2 to 4 credits.

- 1. The nature, scope and history of the museum development in Minnesota museums as they relate to collections therein.
- 2. Museum collections and their attention to indigenous and non-indigenous cultures through dioramas, case displays, and programs.
- 3. The identification, classification, and curation of artifact collections in Minnesota.

# D. Course Learning Outcomes

Upon successful completion of the internship, the student will be able to:

- 1. Articulate knowledge of prehistoric, historic, and contemporary collections at museums.
- 2. Recognize and explain the techniques used in the curation of artifacts in museum collections.
- 3. Describe the methodologies used to communicate the curation, including documentation of artifact curation knowledge clearly and effectively in writing.
- 4. Demonstrate proficiency in understanding how museum collections are developed.
- 5. Describe how professional-level museum displays are planned and developed.
- 6. Reflect on their internship experience and its applicability to future career goals.
