C. Outline of Major Content Areas: Students will understand the history, organization, influences, and delivery of healthcare in the US and abroad. A focus will be on analyzing the factors that have shaped our healthcare system compared to the other parts of the globe. The course will cover types of healthcare institutions, functions of hospitals, and other facilities; accountability in healthcare, hierarchy of the healthcare system, organizational structure, and the role of government in healthcare.

- 1. Articulate the importance of valid and compatible computerized sources as they are used for healthcare related research and documentation.
- 2. Identify the extent of available health education services.
- 3. Explain the scope of healthcare teams..
- 4. Identify gaps in the provision of collaborative health services that are available to individuals.
- 5. Evaluate plans for promoting collaboration efforts among health agencies and organizations with mutual interests.
- 6. Differentiate the availability of information and resources needed to provide healthcare access.
- 7. Critique health care providers' messages to consumers.
