

Course Outline for: MUSC 1113 Concert Choir

A. Course Description:

- 1. Number of credits: 1
- 2. Activity Hours: 200 minutes per week plus one major performance per semester
- 3. Prerequisites: None

This course studies and prepares for public performance choral literature from all musical periods in a variety of styles. Students will use their voices in a manner that promotes healthy vocal production. They will work on developing musical perception skills and vocal production that fosters a unified ensemble sound. Students will have the opportunity to demonstrate the skills they developed through public performances.

C. Outline of Major Content Areas:

This course includes the development of skills required for performance, including:

- 1. Intervals, dynamics, tempo and counting
- 2. Choral skills such as diction, blending and musical phrasing
- 3. Proper training and care of the voice based on healthy physiologically and psychologically based vocal technique

D. Course Learning Outcomes:

Upon successful completion of the course, the student will be able to:

- 1. Use their own voice with the aid of healthy vocal technique
- 2. Perform their own voice part in private or in sectionals (Goal 2a)
- 3. Achieve a unified musical ensemble

E. Methods for Assessing Student Learning:

Methods for assessment may include, but are not limited to, the following:

- 1. Choir members will be graded according to their ability to sing their vocal part and use of their own voice to produce a unified ensemble.
- 2. Choir members must participate and perform at dress rehearsals, concerts, and recording sessions as part of their grade
