In this course, offered through the University of Minnesota, Morris Learning Abroad Center, students will learn about Wolof and Senegalese culture, such as the history of slavery, women in Senegalese society, and current

politics. An important component will be folklore and questions of representation in cinema. After participating in online synchronous course sessions in May, the class will travel to Dakar, Senegal to continue their learning. From Dakar, students will visit the Sodo Bade art colony to participate in various workshops such as dance, sculpture, and drumming. Students will also visit an innovative new school that focuses on technology and environmental sustainability, and will collaborate with local students and staff on a service project.
